Join us as we read stories, sing songs, play color and recognition games, make fun crafts, have a snack and more! Siblings are welcome.

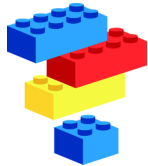
Lego® Club

Saturday, January 13

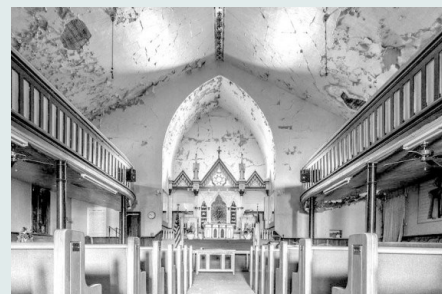
